Embracing the theme *LEGACY*, this latest edition of Lights, Camera, Africa!!! Film Festival 2014 celebrates the continent's rich film-making tradition, connecting the classics to the avant-gardists in an audio-visual history that spans the times and genres. Our festival contextualizes the work of filmmakers as a part of a larger tapestry of African storytelling as a whole. But this edition comes at an especially historic year for Nigeria which marks the centenary of the amalgamation of its southern and northern protectorates.
